### 36-CREDIT ONLINE MASTER'S PROGRAM

Whether you are new to the profession or a Jewish educator who wants to move ahead in your career, you can create a program of study that meets your unique interests. The 36-credit online MJEd degree program may be completed as a stand-alone degree or with a concentration in either Jewish special education or Jewish early childhood education.

This online degree, which includes supervised field experience in your home community, may be completed in two years as a full-time student or in two years plus the intervening summer as a part-time student. Coursework fulfills the core requirements of the RJE (Reform Jewish Educator) credential and may be applied to certification in many states.

As an MJEd candidate, you will join a dynamic community of online students from around the country and the world in an interactive virtual classroom with Hebrew College faculty. You will also build a personal relationship with your faculty advisor, who will help you to create an individualized program and serve as your mentor and guide.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited four-year college or university
- Application, essay and three letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts of previous undergraduate and graduate level study
- Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores from within the past two years
- Admission interview
- Demonstrated proficiency in reading and comprehension of basic biblical Hebrew texts; a working knowledge of fundamental modern Hebrew
- TOEFL scores for applicants whose native language is not English
